Tuesday and Wednesday: Year 9 Parent Teacher Consultations online

Nonsuch chess teams A and B travelled to Guildford to take part as a school for the first time in a girls' chess championship. Team A comprised: Anna (Y13), Maya (Y9), Tiara (Y7) and Team B Vicky (Y13), Nilupuli (Y7), Arushi (Y7) and Srutiga (Y11). The teams played five rounds of chess, competing against 34 other teams. Team A made it to the finals which will take place in April, coming third place overall, following chess championship veterans North London Collegiate and St Paul's Girls. 
