PSHE (including RSE) regular update

Year 7

Year 7 have started a new topic, Living in the Wider World. During their first lesson they identified their personal skills and qualities and thought about how they might use these skills and qualities in their lives now and in the future.

Key lesson objectives:

- To identify your personal skills and qualities
- To consider how to develop your personal skills and qualities further

Year 8

Year 8 have also started a new unit of work called Living in the Wider World. The students have started this topic by learning about why we need to manage our money now and how we can do this.

Key lesson objectives:

- To discuss some of the myths, realities and key terms associated with money
- To explore why we need to manage our money and how bank accounts can help with this
- To understand why there are different types of bank accounts and the range of features available

Year 9

Year 9 have started their new unit of work on mental and physical health by thinking about body image and how it is portrayed in the media.

Key lesson objectives:

- To describe the concept of appearance ideals and the associated pressure.
- To critically analyse images and messages from advertisers, cinema, and social media
- To evaluate the impact of image manipulation on ideas around body image

Year 10

Year 10 have been learning about the electoral system and the importance of voting.

Key lesson objectives:

- To understand arguments for and against voting in the general election
- To explore possible ways of being involved in the democratic process in society and in school
- To consider how democracy can allow for improvement within communities

Year 11 and 13

These year groups have started their exam leave for their GCSE and A-levels.

Year 12

Year 12 students will starting the UCAS processes and will be guided through the registration process.
